MONTHLY TRAINING MINUTE:

There is a bed bug infestation at Charles Crest apartments. Administration and the City are working on remedying the situation but it may take some time. Continue to exercise caution by wearing throw away boot covers, spaying Off on pants and shoes (including the soles) wrapping the patient up and decontamination procedures following the run. A form has been created on Aladtec for tracking bed bug exposures. Please take the time to fill this out so we can have factual documentation to go to the owners with. Today (July 14) the Medic units and quarters were professionally inspected and all were bug free. Keep up the great work on a very tough situation.
