MONTHLY TRAINING MINUTE:

School is back in session next week so here's a quick reminder. At all times, no matter what the emergency, operate emergency vehicles with due regard for safety. When approaching a stopped school bus, slow down and prepare to stop. Pass only when you are positive that the bus driver is aware that you are passing and no children are near the road. When driving through a school zone during restricted times going left of center and/or speeds in excess of 20mph should be the exception not the rule. This should only be done when you are confident that all drivers and pedestrians in the school zone are alert to your presence. If in doubt don't do it, it's only a few seconds!
