RE: Navarre Avenue Safety Improvement Project (LUC-2-21.72 - PID 118234)

Dear Property Owner / Business / Neighbor:

We are writing to advise you that the City of Oregon along with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has a proposed project to improve safety along Navarre Avenue (SR 2) between Isaac Streets Drive and Coy Road by installing a center median, relocating one traffic signal, and adding two new traffic signals. The traffic signals are proposed to be installed at the Harbor Drive, Kingston Court/Planet Fitness, and Kroger Drive intersections and will include pedestrian signals and U-turn bulb-outs. The project will also include resurfacing, pavement markings, and aesthetic improvements. Additional right of way and/or temporary construction easements will be required from some properties with acquisition expected to begin in Summer 2024. The project construction is currently estimated at \$7,500,000 and the city has received \$5,000,000 in ODOT Safety Funding for the project.

Construction is currently scheduled to begin in August 2025 and should be fully completed by July 2026. Additional notices will be provided prior to construction. Throughout construction, at least one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction allowing travel through the construction zone. Access to all adjacent properties will be maintained unless otherwise arranged in advance.

We welcome your questions and comments. To ensure the proposed project is viable and successful, Oregon is seeking comments from the public about the social, environmental, and economic impacts of this proposed project. Issues you may wish to comment on include, but are not limited to, the effect of the project on residents, air quality, the local economy, floodplains, and historic or cultural resources. To ensure your comments may be considered during project development, please submit them no later than Friday, March 29, 2024 via the information below or visit the Department of Public Service Office at the above address.
